Profitability and environmental impacts can go hand in hand

Looking for new revenue opportunities and access to a growing market? Global demand for renewable fuels including sustainable aviation fuels and renewable diesel continues to intensify, creating new demand for low carbon intensity feedstocks such as winter camelina. Planted in the fall, winter camelina allows farmers to tap into this growing demand and benefit from an additional cash crop. As an over-winter crop, winter camelina provides soil health benefits similar to a cover crop and allows a farmer to produce three crops in two years.

How it works

We supply the seed. You seed this fall and harvest next spring. We'll buy your camelina for delivery at our West Fargo plant. As a bonus, you may be eligible to participate state soil and water conservation programs.

What to expect

- 1. Cargill orders and distributes seed.
- 2. Recommended seeding window is mid-September to early October. (Expect small rosettes to develop before snow cover.)
- 3. Expect to harvest between mid-June and early July providing potential to follow with another crop.
- 4. Receive a guaranteed flat price less cost of the seed.
- 5. Cargill West Fargo buys the camelina and picks it up on-farm.
